






Our Dakota Dreams Webinar Series

Fast Track Admission COMING SOON!

Fast Track Admission is a new pilot program in South Dakota that lets high school seniors bypass the college application process for participating universities based on their academic achievements.

PARTICIPATING UNIVERSITY CAMPUSES:

Black Hills State University, Main Campus – Spearfish

Black Hills State University - Rapid City

Northern State University – Aberdeen

South Dakota State University – Brookings

University of South Dakota, Main Campus – Vermillion

University of South Dakota – Sioux Falls

This is a three-year pilot starting in 2024-2025 that includes students in select school districts, including those in Sioux Falls, Aberdeen, and Spearfish. Participation is expected to expand in future years.



Free College Application Period

OCTOBER 1 THROUGH NOVEMBER 30

All students will have a risk-free, no-cost chance to check out and apply to nearly all public post-secondary schools in South Dakota.

During the free application period, students may apply to as many South Dakota public colleges and universities as they wish.

FAFSA Completion

Schedule a Financial Aid Night

Schedule a Financial Aid Event for your parents and students to help them prepare to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You can choose to invite your families to the school to view the presentation in-person or you can host the presentation online.

- 1. Determine possible dates for your financial aid night.
- 2. Contact <u>Mapping Your Future</u> (or a college financial aid office directly) to discuss your plans and to gather more information about event support.
- 3. Promote the event to parents and students.
- 4. Test the technology, especially if you are hosting an online event.
- 5. Have a moderator available. In most events, the counselor will serve as the moderator. This ensures that all questions are heard, and the event runs smoothly.

Membership will require school district superintendents to sign data-sharing agreements before school representatives have access to the FAFSA Completion Portal.

NOTE:

Financial information is not available on the FAFSA Completion Portal, and representatives cannot see to what school(s) a student submitted their FAFSA.

All schools must complete the agreement to have access to the portal.

Private schools will also need to provide student roster information in addition to the agreement.

Dual Enrollment

High School Dual Credit

Through the High School Dual Credit (HSDC) program, current high school juniors and seniors enrolled at public, private, and tribal high schools can enroll in college coursework at the rate of \$50.84 per credit hour (or 1/3 of the total reduced credit hour rate). The State of South Dakota pays the remaining tuition costs.

Concurrent Credit

Concurrent Credit courses are dual credit courses offered at your high school. These courses are taught by a high school teacher who is qualified to teach college-level courses. These courses are offered at \$40 per credit hour. (Note: The Rising Scholar courses through NSU and BHSU are Concurrent Credit.)

Non-Degree Seeking

High school students taking university coursework at the full rate. This is often for students wanting to enroll in coursework that is not a BOR general education course or for students who do not qualify for HSDC.

Students must obtain approval from their high school and courses.

IS DUAL CREDIT THE RIGHT OPTION FOR ME?

We applaud your decision to consider enhancing your high school education and get a jump on your postsecondary career by taking dual credit. However, it is important you consider whether

STUDENT REDUIESS

Dual credit is a great fit for most students who show interest, maturity, and academic readiness, but it may not be a perfect fit for every student. Important factors to show student readiness for dual credit:

- Self-discipline and motivation, especially for online dual credit courses.
 Reading and writing skills.
 Strong computer/technology experience, especially for online dual credit co

IMPACT ON STUDENT RECORD It's important to understand that dual credit courses impact not just the high school transcript but also the college transcript.

Factors to consider with the student record and dual credit:

- Grades earned become part of both the student's permanent high school and postsecondary OPA.
 Pool performance in that credit coverse can impact the continued participation in the data credit program and the standing, and financial and eligibility any located college deminisions, critishnian opportunities, sciedamic standing, and financial and eligibility.

 If students are struggling, encourage them to communicate with the course instructor and seek out seademic support services. Early action on the student's part can be the time and the successful.

Application Submission Period

November 1st – Spring Application Opens March 1st – Summer Application Opens April 1st – Fall Application Opens The SDBOR has created a new website and application forms to make the process of applying for dual enrollment easy! Dual enrollment includes SDBOR High School Dual Credit (HSDC), Concurrent Credit, and Non-Degree Seeking Admission courses. Among others, website features include:

High School Dual Enrollment

What is Dual Enrollment?

Dual enrollment is any college course taken by a high school student that counts for both high school and college credit. High school students applying to take courses prior to high school graduation will utilize this application. Several types of dual enrollment courses fall under this application, which are described below.

High School Dual Credit Program

Through the High School Dual Credit (HSDC) program, current high school juniors and seniors enrolled at public, private, and tribal high schools have the opportunity to enroll in college coursework at the rate of \$50.84 per credit hour (or 1/3 of the total reduced credit hour rate). The State of South Dakota pays the remaining futition costs.

For students to participate in the program, their high schools must have a signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the South Dakota Department of Education (see the list of high schools with an MOU here).

All courses meet the System's General Education requirements at all six Regental institutions. They are taught by university faculty and offered face-to-face at BOR campuses and online. In some cases, high schools may also offer In-District HSDC courses taught by university faculty on-site at your high school.

Concurrent Credit

Concurrent Credit courses are dual credit courses offered at your high school. These courses are taught by a high school teacher who is qualified to teach college-level courses. These courses are offered at \$40 per credit hour. (Note: The Risins Scholar courses through NSU and BHSU are Concurrent Credit.)

Non-Degree Seeking Admission

In certain instances, high school students in grades 9-12 may wish to take courses from BOR universities at the full tution rate (including applicable fees). This is known as non-degree seeking high school enrollment. Students must obtain approval from their high school to take courses under non-degree seeking admission, which would count for credit at the high school level as well. This may be an option for students in the situations described below.

- A student wanting to enroll in a course that is not eligible for the HSDC program (i.e. a course that is not part of the BOR General Education curriculum.)
- A student does not meet the criteria for the High School Dual Credit or Concurrent Credit Programs.
 Examples of this include:
 - Not meeting the academic requirements of the initial eligibility criteria,
 - Students in grades 9-10 (who are not eligible for the HSDC program), or
 - Students who do not reside in or attend school in South Dakota

Application Submission Period

- November 1st Spring Application Opens
- March 1st Summer Application Opens
- April 1st Fall Application Opens

Check with your high school counselor/administration for registration deadlines within your school.

It is recommended that all applications be submitted one week prior to the start of the course. However, if a student is delayed in submitting their application, an exception can be accommodated up to the first day of the course(s) the student is enrolling in. This best practice is to ensure students can effectively start the course in a timely manner. A delay in apolying may delay a student's enrollment until after classes have already started.

Note: High school students are not registered for courses until roughly two weeks after the application opens, as high school students are not placed into courses until the registration period for traditional students closes. Students will be registered for courses in the order their applications are received.



- First-Time Students: If you've never taken a course through a SDBOR university before, you'll need to <u>create a</u> new account. First-time students will use a personal email address to set up their account. (This is due to firewalls that are often set up for K12 student emails.)
- Continuing Students: If you've previously taken a course through a SDBOR university, you do not need to set up an account. You will log in to <u>your dashboard</u> with your university-provided email and password. The dashboard is where you can send reminder notifications and change the email address for the parent/guardian or high school official.

CREATING THE PARENT ACCOUNT

- When your child completes their portion of the dual enrollment application, you will receive an email with the subject line "Parent/Guardian Consent for [Student Name] for High School Student Dual Enrollment Admissions." At the end of that email, there is a link to complete your section of the form. You will <u>create a new account</u> and complete the parent portion of the application.
- When setting up your account, make sure to check that you are using the correct name. The name used to sign the application will need to match the name on the account. (i.e., if William is used as the first name on the account, the application cannot be signed using the first name Bill)
- . Should you need to make changes to your account, log in to Dynamic Forms and click on the person icon in the upper right corner of the page. Then select "Update Profile", make necessary revisions, and save your changes



SIGNING THE APPLICATION

- Parents will be required to sign off on the student application under the expectations and guidelines of the dual enrollment program, as well as the financial terms and conditions.
- After signing, click through the remainder of application by selecting "Next" at the bottom of each page. At the end of the application, click "Submit" to complete the parent portion of the application.



DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAMS

- High School Dual Credit (HSDC)(Juniors Seniors): Courses are offered face-to-face on campus or online and are taught by campus faculty; in-district courses may be taught by university faculty at the high school. These courses are offered at a cost of \$50.85/credit hour to the student.
- Concurrent and Rising Scholar (Juniors Seniors): Dual enrollment courses offered at some high schools and taught by a qualified high school teacher. These courses are offered at \$40/credit hour.
- · Non-Degree Seeking, Full Tuition Rate (Freshman Seniors): Approval from high school is required and can count towards credit at the high school level. These courses are offered at the full tuition rate, including student fees, but are an option for students who do not qualify for the HSDC or Concurrent/Rising Scholar programs, or who wish to take courses that are not offered as part of those programs.


Online Scholarship Application




Math Pathway 6 Example
